EDUCATIONAL SPOT FOR 11 OCTOBER

In 1925, Kiwanis Clubs along the border of 18 states and provinces erected 50 Peace Markers to celebrate 125 years of peace since the end of the War of 1812. The Port Stanley Marker was installed in 1942 on the bluff overlooking the harbour by Kiwanians attending the Kiwanis International Convention in Cleveland, Ohio.

As part of the park renovation, this granite Marker has been moved to a more visible location close to the King George VI Lift Bridge to highlight its uniqueness.
