It was mainly because her Dad was laid off from AV Roe after the government cancelled the Arrow airplane project. He found work in London at General Steel. Kate said her Dad, Fred Anderson enjoyed the time he was a

member of Middlesex Kiwanis.

She believes we need to be open to immigrants to help our country grow and recently 76 people from 26 countries became Canadian citizens.

The Liberal Government believes Canadian seniors need help and last March appointed Filomena Tassi, Minister of Seniors: Kate said 100,000 seniors have been lifted out of poverty because the age for collecting old age security has been rolled back to 65 from 67. She is involved in working on the first Federal Accessibility Act.



She believes the new USMCA agreement is very good for Canada and that the legalizing of marijuana on Oct 17 is good because the present system is not working. Kate brought pamphlets about scams involving seniors. Ken Keith thanked the speaker.
