program was started in 2014 to help children who are below the provincial average in reading skills. The program is mostly run by volunteers with one volunteer for every 2 children. Three 2 month sessions are run per year. The time is 4:30 pm to 5:30 pm. Each session begins with a short time for the kids to 'just talk' and at 4 pm there is a snack served. There are iPad to help encourage the kids to like to read. In order to identify the children who need help reading the program

administrators' work closely with the schools and the child's teacher is asked to provide a simple reading assessment.
