**Bruce Lundgren** introduced the speaker Mark Tovey, a Postdoctoral Fellow in Public History, Department of History, Western University, who is conducting a study of the history of the area bounded by Grosvenor, Colborne, Piccadilly, St. George streets. Mark indicated that the primary focus of his study was to study neighbourhood

cohesion, in particular how stories play a role in this mechanism. The commercial district on Richmond Street from the CPR tracks to Oxford Street and presented using a series of photo images of the streetscape to illustrate the changes that have occurred since 1925. A recording of an interview with an older employee of Stan C. Reade photography store was played to provided some background concerning the changes that have occurred over the years in the stores in this region.



A number of other recordings were played to indicate the rich history that exists within this study area. The information on key historical sights will be available to visitors to this area through 'Hear-Here' signs attached to local lampposts that provide instructions on how to listen to info about a site by dialing a number and listening to a message on a cell phone. The set up of this system and installation of signs



within the study area are scheduled to be undertaken in the next 6 months. A presentation of this project will be included in the Doors Open program on September 16<sup>th</sup>.
