Lewis Coray introduced his daughter Pamela Coray, Development Manager at Anova for the past 17 years. Lewis said he is proud to have such a smart daughter. Pamela told us that the calls to their telephone helpline have increased since the London Distress Centre closed. Anova's



services include helping clients find geared to income housing, helping women go through the court system, sexual assault counselling for women.

The average stay in shelter is 42 days. In 2011 Anova's retail clothing store opened in the Bellwood Plaza and last year it made a profit of \$65,000. The name Anova for this organization came about because an anova is a shooting star with a short life and it is hoped that some time in the future Anova London will not be needed. The mission statement of Anova is: Creating communities of safe spaces, compassion, healing, renewal, hope, resilience and advocating for social and political change.
