Attendance: Graham Laing reported on members present.

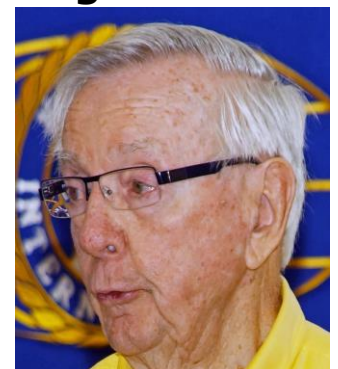
