Andrew Oding was introduced by Russ Knight. Andrew talked to us about energy efficient homes and by 2035 the goal is to have all homes net zero energy efficient. This means the home will produce all the energy the home needs. If there is an energy audit every six years it will be possible to see how energy efficient we are. Ideally in 5



to 10 years all homes in Ontario have to be energy zero. Gas companies won't make money selling gas but will make money from the gas lines into buildings. By 2025 homes will be required to reduce operational carbon. Climate change is a factor in the necessity to make homes as air tight as possible and as a result moisture will also have to be controlled. It is necessary to find ways to keep climate change at safe levels. A net zero building has no overall carbon emissions. Typically, this is achieved by using low carbon energy sources, such as those provided by renewables, drastically lowering energy consumption by using highly energy-efficient systems. Heat pumps are a machine of the future to take heat from the ground to use in homes. Bruce Lundgren thanked the speaker.
